# Camping- what to bring check list

This is a general list to serve as a guide for packing. Not all items may be needed and you are welcome to bring more. New families wishing to borrow a tent please talk to a committee member.

# Each person needs:

- Sleeping bag or bed roll and Pillow
- Toiletries (soap, hairbrush, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant)
- Towels (Showers available)
- Flashlight extra batteries
- Clothes appropriate for the weather (extra socks and underwear recommended)
- Sweatshirt and/or jacket
- Sneakers and/or hiking boots
- Rain poncho
- Hat
- o Medical safety / permission slip A & B
- Medications\*\*\*

### Cooking/Dining:

- Knives, forks, spoons
- Plates, bowels, cups
- Cooking utensils (pots/pans, spoons, spatulas, coffee pot, cutting board, etc.)
- Table
- Groceries
- Camp grill (optional)
- Camp stove (Recommended)
- Waterproof matches
- Ice chest (with ice or blue ice)
- Dish washing detergent (Biodegradable like Dawn) and bleach
- Pot scrubber brush, sponge
- 3 dish buckets
- Water jugs
- Paper towels
- Dish towels
- Trash bags

#### Each scout should bring:

- Class A uniform for opening and closing flag ceremonies
- Pack shirt to wear Saturday
- Water bottle that can be carried during the day
- Cub scout Handbook (in zippy bag)
- Day pack\*\*

## Each Family needs:

- Tent
- Tarp/Ground cloth

## <u>Safety:</u>

- First Aid Kit
- Insect repellent (recommend DEET)
- Sunscreen

### Fun / helpful ideas:

- Camera
- Compass
- Phone charger
- Portable charging station
- Folding chairs
- Cot, air mattress, foam roll
- Tent broom
- Mallet
- Rope/Nylon cord
- Outdoor games/ball
- Notebook and pen/pencil
- Books (Bird/tree identification or others)
- Binoculars
- Lantern

<u>Please note</u>: NO alcohol or tobacco of any kind (including e-cigs) in camp. Smoking will ONLY be permitted in the parking lot away from Scouts view. This policy will be strictly enforced and violations will result in being asked to leave.

<sup>\*\*</sup>A Day Pack is about teaching the boys to be prepared. It can be in a small backpack, string bag, fanny pack or any other bag that can be carried, by the boy, hands free. (Most things can be found in a dollar store) Discuss this with your Den Leader and/or read your Handbook.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup>Medications must be in adult custody. They should be in original packages with labels. Please keep them out of reach of all children.
